Pioneer Families,

This school-based need takes on more significance with the growth of support services provided to the students. I ask that parents be open to the placement needs identified by your child's teacher. With the above in mind, parents are asked to only provide input that would seriously impact your child's ability to be successful in school. The request for a specific teacher isn't a part of this process. We recognize the need to maintain open lines of communication and will consider information about your child and what suits their learning from your perspective. Please provide this information in writing by May 1st to the Office of the Principal.





COMMUNITY ASKED TO PARTICIPATE IN STRATEGIC PLANNING SURVEY



Webster CSD is excited to offer the One Webster community the opportunity to give us feedback in our upcoming Strategic Planning Survey. The strategic planning process for our district began in 2010, and this is the seventh time the survey has been available to the community for completion. Information gathered from the survey is invaluable as it guides implementation of new district goals and initiatives and is also used to evaluate ongoing district programs that impact our students and families.

Webster CSD's Board of Education and the district are surveying Webster CSD students, faculty, staff, and the community at large. The online strategic planning survey will open on Wednesday, April 10 and be available for completion by Wednesday, April 24. Parents will be sent a separate email from wcsdmessages@webstercsd.org via SurveyMonkey on April 10 with the subject "Webster CSD Strategic Planning" with a one-time use survey link to complete. *Please note that WCSD staff members and students will complete different versions of this survey.*

The anonymous survey takes approximately 10 minutes to complete. Paper surveys will also be available at the Webster Aquatic Center, Webster Recreation Center, Webster Public Library, and Penfield Public Library. Music “Notes”

While this article will be read in April, it is being written in March, when many people are celebrating Music in Our Schools month. Some people may think that music class is a “break” from the regular classroom; that it’s about singing songs and playing instruments; that it’s an “extra” part of a student’s education. While they are partially right, have you thought about how closely music ties in with the rest of your child’s school day?

Math- While it is a simplified form of math, counting and listening to music that has beats in groups of 2’s and 3’s is a skill that is addressed in all grade levels. Fractions come into play when learning about rhythmic note values.

Science- Music is a science in itself which deals with different ways to produce and change sound, acoustics, and timbre.

History- By learning about music from the past, students gain insight into a composer’s ideas and feelings and gain insight into a different time from our own.

Geography- Music is universal, yet unique to every culture. By learning about music from other countries, we gain an appreciation for another’s culture and way of life.

Physical Education- In some countries, the words for “music” and “dance” are the same. For them, dancing IS music and music IS dance. From kindergarteners stepping the steady beat to fifth graders performing a complicated folk dance, music is in our bodies and in our soul. (When was the last time you grooved to the beat when you thought no one was looking?)

I haven’t even covered how music encompasses language arts, visual art, and foreign languages! So you see, music is everywhere, and it’s more than just an “extra” class in school.

Thank you for your support of music in Webster schools. When your child comes home and won’t stop singing the song they learned in music class, when you have to sit and listen to your budding instrumentalist practice, and when you sit through a school concert, realize that music is the language that connects all subject areas, creates a bond between people, and allows us to express what words alone cannot.


