### **Kindergarten Orientation and Registration:**

Do you have a child who will turn 5 on or before December 1st? If so, they are eligible for the Kindergarten program offered in our schools. 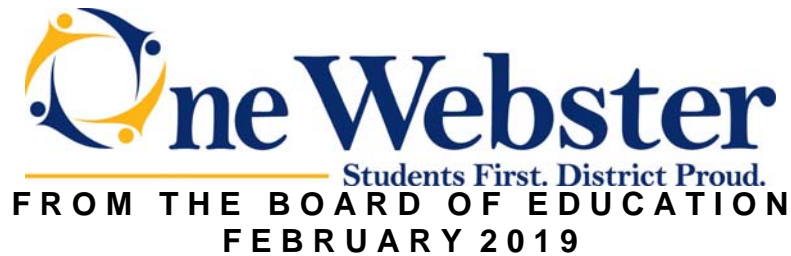

WCSD is pleased to announce the opening of **WonderCare**, the district's new before and after school childcare program. WonderCare will open its doors in September 2019 at each of WCSD's seven elementary schools and will be available to all WCSD-enrolled kindergarten through sixth grade students.

WonderCare has been established in an ongoing effort to ease the transition for families as the district prepares to shift to an earlier start time for elementary schools in fall 2019. New start times for elementary schools will be 7:45 a.m.-2:15 p.m., and 8:45 a.m. - 3:15 p.m. for secondary schools (middle and high schools), with all times plus or minus five minutes.

These evenings will be geared for parents only. (Family meet and greet nights will take place in August.) If you cannot attend your home school date, you may attend at another location.

The program has been established in an ongoing effort to ease the transition for families as the district prepares to shift to an earlier start time for elementary schools in fall 2019. New start times for elementary schools will be 7:45 a.m.-2:15 p.m., and 8:45 a.m. - 3:15 p.m. for secondary schools (middle and high schools), with all times plus or minus five minutes.

Families enjoyed listening to stories and songs with Jason Poole and Shana Lynott from the Webster Public Library during Plank North's Family Fun Night. The Webster Public Library has a great collection of books, audiobooks, games and movies. In addition, there are awesome activities for all ages. **Kindergarten students** are learning about the Caldecott Medal which is an award presented to an illustrator of a picture book. We have read several award-winning books and students completed related activities.

**First graders** learned about the difference between facts and opinions which correlates with their class opinion writing unit. Students demonstrated their knowledge by playing Kahoot and giving opinions about some stories we read.



**Second graders** are learning about Greek mythology by engaging in a variety of STEAM-based learning centers. They are designing Greek god and goddess trading cards, reading Greek myths, playing Race to a Quarter, and building the Parthenon and Temple of Zeus out of Keva Planks.

**Third graders** are learning how to use the online library catalog to locate books in the library. The goal is for them to become independent library users.

**Fourth graders** are learning about various literary genres by rotating to a variety of STEAM-based learning centers, including QR code book trailers, Make Beliefs Comix, online shelving games, and much more.



**In fifth grade**, I am reading the students *Harvesting Hope: The Story of Cesar Chavez*. This book correlates to their classroom learning involving human rights, and they should find many similarities to *Esperanza Rising*. They are also learning about digital citizenship through a variety of online and offline activities.

## February 2019 NEWS FROM ART CLASS with Ms. Palermo...

### February STUDENT ARTISTS OF THE MONTH.....



Kindergarten student **Kathryn Ewanow** is our primary level (grades K-2) **Student Artist of the Month**. Here is an above image of Kathryn's colorful mixed media cityscape.

4th grade student **Max Burton** is our intermediate level (grades 3-5) **Student Artist of the Month**. Here is an image below of Max's three-dimensional forms collage.



**WHAT WE ARE LEARNING AND WORKING ON IN ART CLASS...**

Our **kindergarten** students are completing their textured painting of a seahorse in the ocean. We read Eric Carle's book, Mister Seahorse to get creative inspiration for our project. Students did a wonderful job mixing ocean colors like turquoise and lime green. Our **1st grade** students are completing their imaginary texture unit - create an owl in its habitat by carving the design into a foam plate. Make the tree branches look bumpy and the owl look soft and feathery by carving various line types into the design. Students then made several prints in two class sessions to put into their book with a laminated cover of their favorite owl print. This project incorporated ELA into art - using sentence starters, students completed a short writing piece about their owl such as my owl eats worms or candy bars and lives in my house! This is a special project that students will look at years from now. Our **2nd grade** students have started their Monet inspired lily pond with bridge composition for their unit in warm and cool colors. Student learned about drawing realistic nature elements and how colors portray different emotions in art. Our **3rd grade** students have started their complementary colors unit with an Australian symbol project. Students learned that a color near its complement in artwork makes these colors brighter (primary blue is the complement of secondary orange for example). Our **4th grade** students are completing their three-dimensional forms collage project. Students drew 3D forms from 2D shapes such as creating a cube from a square. They organized the cut-out forms into a still life collage then showed the direction of the light source by creating table shadows for each form. **5th grade** students have started their birch tree composition. This project focuses on intermediate colors on the color wheel. By mixing a primary color into a secondary color you will create an intermediate or tertiary color such as red-violet or blue-green for example. Students will also show the light source in the landscape of birch trees with shadows.

As part of the third, fourth, and fifth grade music curriculums, students learn to play the recorder. Order forms for recorders will go home with third grade students and fourth and fifth graders who need to purchase a new recorder.

We have been preparing in music classes for this exciting field trip by learning about the different families of instruments and doing listening activities centered around the pieces we will hear the RPO play.

### NOTES FROM THE NURSE:

Tis The Season” for winter illnesses!

Once again, a reminder about infection control: cover your mouth and nose when you sneeze, throw away your tissues promptly, and wash your hands! Influenza (the flu) is easily transmitted through the air (sneezing/coughing) and close personal contact. Cold and flu viruses can linger on doorknobs, telephone receivers, computer keyboards, and other surfaces. It is important to wash your hands frequently and try to avoid rubbing your eyes and nose or putting your hands around your mouth.

The decision to keep your child home from school is not always clear cut. Most often your child will do fine in school (with a little encouragement and a box of tissues). Here are some guidelines to use in determining whether your child should stay home.

- Any condition you think or know is contagious to others.
- Fever greater than 100.4 orally.
- Child is too ill, sleepy or lethargic to sit still all day in school.
- Severe sore throat, with fever or lethargy, or lasting longer than 48 hours. (Contact your health care provider.) **Reminder:** If your child has had a throat culture for strep, he/she **may NOT** be in school until the results are known. If your child is diagnosed with strep, he/she **MUST be on the antibiotic 24 hours before returning to school.**
- Red/runny eyes (until cleared as non-contagious by your health care provider).
- Severe ear pain or drainage from the ear. (Contact your health care provider.)
- Severe headache, especially if accompanied by fever. (Contact your health care provider.)
- Honey-crusted sores around the nose or mouth. (Contact your health care provider.)
- Significant rash accompanied by fever, sore throat, stomach ache, or a rash in various stages including boils, sores and bumps. (Contact your health care provider.)

### WHOOPING COUGH

A reminder about **Pertussis (Whooping Cough)**: Pertussis is always present in the community and usually starts to increase about the same time as the flu. If your child develops a **persistent cough** that becomes worse over time, he/she should **be evaluated by his/her physician** so that the appropriate tests are performed and treatment is initiated. Pertussis most often occurs in infants and younger children who frequently acquire the disease from older siblings, adolescents, and adults who have a mild disease. While Pertussis most frequently occurs in unvaccinated or under-vaccinated children, it also occurs in school-age children and adults who have had the recommended Pertussis immunizations.
