Class Placement Input:

Class placement of the students is a significant decision with many perspectives to consider. Recognizing the importance of a child's classroom assignment doesn't make it any easier. From the school's perspective, our ability to locate students with similar learning needs can be very helpful in scheduling the services these students require to help them be successful academically. This school-based need takes on more significance with the growth of support services provided to the students. I ask that parents be open to the placement needs identified by your child's teacher.

With the above in mind, parents are asked to only provide input that would seriously impact your child's ability to be successful in school. The request for a specific teacher isn't a part of this process. We recognize the need to maintain open lines of communication and will consider information about your child and what suits their learning from your perspective. Please provide this information in writing by May 1 to the Office of the Principal.

March Parent-Teacher Conferences:

Parents should have received a message from their classroom teacher(s) on Wednesday, February 14 regarding scheduling a conference date and time. Parent Teacher Conferences for Webster CSD students grades PreK-5 will take place over four days, March 14-15 and 21-22. Conferences are held in the afternoon on these days. Kindergarten Registration:

Registration for kindergarten for the 24-25 school year has opened and it is completely online! Welcome to the Class of 2037! Parents/guardians who have a child who will be 5 years old on or before December 1, 2024, that child is eligible for kindergarten enrollment for the 24-25 school year. If you have existing children in the Webster CSD please go through your parent portal account to register as it will pre-fill in most of the application for you. If you are a new family to the district, please go to websterschools.org/registration for more information and to compete the 100% online process. If you do not have access to a computer, you may make an appointment to use the Student Registration kiosk located at the district offices (door 2), 119 South Avenue, Webster. WEBSTER CSD CELEBRATES MUSIC IN OUR SCHOOLS/YOUTH ART MONTH!

Our district is looking forward to celebrating the talents of our student musicians and artists with thousands of other districts throughout the nation during March, which is Music In Our Schools and Youth Art Month. While our district hosts concerts and art shows throughout the year, following are just two examples of the outstanding opportunities for community audiences this month:

- Nazareth College's Arts Center Gallery, 4245 East Avenue, Rochester, is celebrating *Shared Spaces*. This biennial show allows local artist teachers to submit one work of a chosen student alongside a work of their own, celebrating the unique apprenticeship process that occurs between teacher and student. Our district has several students and teachers represented, so be sure to visit the exhibit through March 10. Gallery hours are Tuesday-Thursday 12:00-5:00 p.m., Friday-Saturday 12:00-8:00 p.m., and Sunday 12:00-5:00 p.m.
- The curtain goes up on the Spry Middle School Drama Club's production of SpongeBob the Musical: Youth Edition on March 8-9. And, Webster Thomas High School's production of DreamWorks Shrek the Musical hits the stage on March 21-23. Watch for ticket information on websterschools.org.

PREKINDERGARTEN 2024-25 SCHOOL YEAR LOTTERY NOW OPEN!



The online lottery application for our prekindergarten program is now open and will remain open until March 14. One Webster families with a child who will be 4 years old on or before December 1, 2024, but who are not eligible for kindergarten, that child is eligible for prekindergarten enrollment for the upcoming school year. Webster CSD PreK is a play-based program that engages students in social and emotional skills with a heavy emphasis on communication. The district offers both full-

day and half-day options for families. Locations are determined by the lottery and according to the child's home catchment for kindergarten. 


