WEBSTER CSD COMMUNITY APPROVES CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT



Thank you to our One Webster community members who headed to the polls on Wednesday, October 11, to vote on *Building Our Future*, the district's proposed capital improvement project. The community-wide vote resulted in approval of the \$85 million project with 1,626 yes votes and 829 no votes, a 66% approval rate.

Building Our Future will affect all 11 schools with zero tax impact for district residents. The project is focused on the district's ongoing commitment to providing a safe educational environment for students. Renovations and improvements at every school will ensure that all students have safe, accessible spaces to learn well into the future. If you would like to learn

What Do Young People Learn While Singing in a Chorus?

When they become aware that their voice is heard above the others and they begin to blend their voices, they learn **teamwork**.

When they follow their music director's hands through a series of meter and dynamic changes, they learn **accuracy**.

When they begin to appreciate, or "grow into" a piece of music, as they would a "hand me down" jacket, they learn **patience**.

When they try out for a solo and don't get it, they learn **humility**.

When they refrain from asking questions that could wait until after rehearsal, they learn **respect**.

When they bound out of their singing positions to give a "high five" because they finally sang their most difficult piece straight through for the first time, they learn **perseverance**.

When they perform in front of an audience, they learn **risk taking**.

When they perform that difficult piece successfully in concert, they learn genuine **pride and self-esteem**.

Research shows time and again that students have only to gain from involvement in the arts.

A well organized, sustained education in music gives children intellectual and creative skills that last a lifetime.




