What a great beginning to the school year we've had in music class! Here are some of the highlights so far:

- Kindergarteners have been singing songs and playing games with a farm theme. We have also been learning how to play several percussion instruments- maracas, the cowbell, tambourines, and rhythm sticks.
- First graders have been singing the saga of Larry the Lobster. Lots of work on our singing voices and playing instruments at the right time in the song.
- Second graders have been building on the basic skills they learned in first grade. They are reviewing mallet technique and enjoying playing the barred instruments.
- Third graders are learning about singing in unison and in canon. It's much more difficult than the songs they sang in second grade!
- Fourth graders are at the beginning of a project that has students creating patterns and rhythms using hand drums. We are exploring how to use the drums to create unique sounds to incorporate into the patterns. Oh! And we're singing a great song about junk food.
- Fifth graders are really taking their skills to a whole new level. We are singing more difficult songs and working on skills needed for playing in an ensemble. Simple things like starting and stopping at the same time can be quite the challenge!



Library News






