Webster CSD Announces Athletic Hall of Fame

Webster CSD is thrilled to announce the establishment of the Webster Athletic Hall of Fame. Founded during the 2024-25 school year, the Hall of Fame will honor the distinguished athletes, coaches, administrators, and community members who have contributed to the rich athletic legacy of Webster High School, Schroeder High School, and Thomas High School. This initiative celebrates the exceptional achievements of individuals – whether Ridgemen, Lakers, Warriors, Titans, or Lions – who have shaped the winning traditions of Webster's public high schools.

Candidates for induction must have either participated with distinction in one or more varsity sports or made significant contributions as athletic directors or coaches within Webster's public high schools. Alumni are eligible for consideration at a minimum of 10 years post-graduation.

All athletes and coaches must have maintained good standing during their time with Webster athletics and continued to exhibit exemplary character and conduct, serving as positive role models for the community both during and after their involvement with the school district.

District Budget Vote and BOE Candidate Election Results

Webster CSD residents approved the 2025-26 school budget at the May 20 vote. Results from the budget vote and board of education election are as follows:

Budget = APPROVED YES = 3,211 (71.1%)

NO = 1,306 (28.9%)

YES = 3.130 (70%)

NO = 1,363 (30%)

Proposition #2 for purchase of one electric school bus = APPROVED

YES = 2,305 (51%)

NO = 2,183 (49%)


