

Protocol in the Event of School Closings; Early Dismissal Due to Inclement Weather

Webster CSD families are reminded that if weather prohibits students from attending school or necessitates closing school early, this information will be communicated as soon as it is available using the district's ParentSquare system. For this reason, parents/guardians need to make sure their contact information is up-to-date with their child(ren)'s school(s). Parents/guardians can do this in one of three ways:

1. Go to websterschools.org, select the Parent Square button, log in and update contact information there.
2. Go to websterschools.org, select the Parent & Student Portal button, log in to IC and update contact information there.
3. Contact the main office of each of their child(ren)'s school(s) and provide the correct information.

Closing information is also provided on the district website at websterschools.org, on the district Facebook page @WebsterCentralSchools, and to local television and radio stations.

When school is closed due to weather, all aquatics, community education, and evening classes and activities are canceled as well. WonderCare may be an exception; please consult their website at websterschools.org/wondercare or [Facebook.com/WonderCare](https://www.facebook.com/WonderCare).

Webster CSD offers a comprehensive prekindergarten program. Families with a child who will be 4 years old on or before December 1, 2026, but who are not eligible to kindergarten, that child is eligible for prekindergarten enrollment for the upcoming school year. 

Music "Notes"



As the second marking period draws to a close at the end of January, parents of 1st and 2nd graders will be able to see how their child is progressing in music class. (3rd, 4th and 5th graders will receive their grades for music class at the end of the school year. Kindergarteners do not receive a grade for music.) A variety of aspects and skills are assessed and reported at this time. Here are the areas that are assessed for each student using the "I can" statements:

Artistic Literacy

- I can demonstrate my knowledge of musical concepts.
- I can utilize my singing voice with accuracy.
- I can play instruments with accuracy.
- I can persevere in the process of music learning.

As you can see, music class is not just about singing fun, cute songs. Since many of these aspects are skills based, most of the assessing goes on during music class within the context of a game or whole-class activity. Any written quizzes or tests are carefully planned and prepared for in music class.

Grading musical skills at the elementary age is particularly challenging because the development happens at a unique time for each child. Sometimes it even happens overnight! A student who has not "found" their singing voice may all of a sudden come to class the next day singing right on pitch. So, if your child receives a lower grade on their report card, please realize that that is very likely to change as they continue to work towards achieving the standards.


Happy New Year from the library!



